FOLLOW-UP WORK

Work through the steps and then contact your PHSC

As we collect our closing surveys from the Class of 2024, we will begin to have a clearer picture of the current admission landscape. Updated data will be loaded into MaiaLearning over the summer. In the meantime:

- Complete the tasks listed in your MaiaLearning dashboard.
- Narrow down your list of options.
- · Consider which teacher to ask for a recommendation.
- Determine which colleges will still require standardized tests. A complete list of test-optional schools can be found HERE. Discuss your testing strategy with your PHSC.
- Visit the "Schedule a Meeting" page in Canvas to setup an appointment to discuss the progress you've made on your follow-up work and get your questions answered.

COLLEGE VISITS

Colleges are eager to connect with you! Discover all the options for how to explore colleges.

Check each college website for on-campus or virtual visit options such as:

- · Admission information sessions
- Chat sessions with your local representative
- · Campus tours

By registering for and attending on-campus and virtual sessions, colleges will be able to know you're actively researching all they have to offer.

Utilizing virtual offerings can be a useful way to prioritize where you will visit when able.

Follow schools on social media to get a feel for their unique environment.

Keep your Maia college list up to date to be notified when colleges schedule visits to New Trier this fall!

EXPAND YOUR HORIZON

Think broadly about your future and what is important to you. Explore the resources in Canvas and MaiaLearning to discover more about:

- Gap year
- International colleges
- 2 year/transfer resources
- Skilled trade/apprenticeship
- · Military service options
- Affinity resources (such as supports for LGBTQIA, BIPOC, religious needs, etc.)
- Students seeking accommodations
- College-bound athletes
- · Fine and performing arts applicants

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Be thinking about which teacher you'd like to ask for a letter of recommendation. Typically these letters need to be from a junior year, core academic subject teacher. We would encourage you to schedule a time outside of class to connect with your teacher before the end of the school year to ask if they can support you with a recommendation. Many teachers may ask you to complete the Teacher Recommendation Form which can be found on the Junior Class page in Canvas or is linked HERE. Questions? Ask your NT counselor.

TESTING, TESTING, 1..2..3...

As the vast majority of schools continue to implement a test-optional admissions review, students should prioritize the learning in their current coursework, as that will be the best demonstration of academic preparedness. To see the current list of test-optional colleges, click HERE. Visit ACT or SAT if you would like to register for an upcoming test. PHSC can provide guidance on which path might be best to consider.

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SUMMER, SUMMERTIME!

NEED SOME SUMMER PLANS?

Consider the wide variety of ways you can use your time constructively this summer...

- Consider finding a part-time job, pursuing volunteer work, or learning a new skill. Check out the New Trier Job Board (keep scrolling to link to it!). It can also be found on our website or the Resources page in MaiaLearning and PHSC Canvas.
- Look for ways to help! Be a mentor to a sibling; do chores around the house (without being asked!); help an elderly neighbor with their yard work. Think of ways you can contribute. It will mean the world to someone else, and you will learn more about yourself in the process. If you don't know how to do your own laundry or cook your own meals, take the time to learn now. Come freshman year of college, you'll be glad you did.
- Check out all the experiential learning opportunities being provided by colleges and organizations around the country. Investigate options for some of the schools on your list to see what opportunities are available. Visit the Enrichment tab in MaiaLearning to discover the possibilities.
- Want to stretch your brain but not your budget?
 Explore taking a Massive Online Open Course
 (MOOC) through providers such as edx.org or coursera.org, offering thousands of different courses from top institutions worldwide.

FINANCIAL AID

If you are interested in getting a better handle on the cost of college and what aid you may qualify for, there are a few tools you will want to check out.

NET PRICE CALCULATOR

All colleges are federally mandated to have a Net Price Calculator on their website. To find this on a school's site, simply type "Net Price Calculator" into the search bar of the individual school. Completing this 15-20 minute exercise will provide you with an early read on what needbased or merit-based aid you might qualify for at this institution.

FEDERAL STUDENT AID ESTIMATOR

While the FAFSA cannot be available until October of senior year, you can complete the Federal Student Aid Estimator now to get an estimate of your eligibility for federal aid. On average it takes 5-10 minutes to complete. Please click <u>HERE</u> to visit the site.

Advisery Visits (Jr & Sr Years)

Post-high school counselors regularly visit adviseries to share essential information and PHSC logistics.

Consistent student advisery attendance is strongly recommended.

Initial PHSC Appointment

During second semester junior year, students conduct initial appointments with their post-high school counselor.

Student-Counselor Meetings

After the initial PHSC meeting, students can schedule ongoing one-on-one meetings with their counselor. Students should use the PHSC Canvas page to schedule their follow-up meetings.

Note: Anchor Days are student drop-in days for PHSC. No appointment needed!



Letter of Recommendation

Students should work with their posthigh school counselor to determine if a teacher letter might be required for their college apps. If so, students should connect with an academic core teacher before the end of junior year.



Summer Essay Workshops

In June and July, PHSC will host inperson college essay workshops. We will discuss prompts, share brainstorming activities, and allow for drafting & on-the-spot feedback.




