Summer Programming

New Trier's post-high school counselors work many weeks throughout the summer in order to assist students with their post-secondary planning. Finalizing a college list and beginning the work of the application and essays help promote a smooth transition to the demands of the senior year schedule. While the majority of programming is specifically for rising seniors, the summer evening seminars feature prominent guest speakers who discuss topics of interest to sophomore, junior, and senior students and parents. The following services and programs are offered each summer for rising seniors:

- Individual review of essays by counselors
- Continuing individual counseling meetings

Philosophy

The post-secondary planning process is a major step in each student's independence, and it is the counselor's role to empower and help students become autonomous. This is a decision-making process through which students assess their strengths and preferences in order to make informed, well-deliberated choices.

We believe that...

- The college search and application process is individual for each student.
- The process of investigating and researching options is an important step in a student's development.
- The student, parent, and counselor must work in collaboration together.
- Parents need to be supportive and be active listeners. Opinions can be extremely influential, both positively and negatively.
- Students need to take the most academically challenging and appropriate curriculum in light of their individual abilities and overall curricular and co-curricular obligations.
- Counselors help develop a suitable list of schools, assist with the tasks involved in applying and with making informed decisions, and help the student take ownership of the process.

Services Offered

- Provide group guidance through adviser rooms beginning sophomore year
- Counsel all students with their course registration decisions
- Meet individually with juniors and their parents to generate a list of post-secondary options to investigate
- Develop a framework of schools that match the student's wishes and abilities
- Determine, organize, and assist with the tasks involved with the final list of schools, including completing applications, sending test scores, securing recommendations and writing and revising the essay
- Brainstorm and review application writing requirements
- Assist with special education transition to college
- Assist with the athletic recruiting process
- Write an individual letter of recommendation for each student
- Assist with scholarship and financial aid process
- Provide alternatives to college
- Help with decision making involved with the application and selection of post-secondary options
