Description

Mentors play a key role in helping guide students through Senior Project.

All New Trier employees are invited to be Senior Project Mentors.

Mentors are asked to work with no more than three Senior Project students.

Students may not choose their Adviser as a Mentor.

Mentor Role Before Project Begins

Help the student brainstorm ideas for a Senior Project, and help find a Community Sponsor if necessary.

Help the student, as needed, with proofreading the Proposal. If necessary, assist the student with any proposal revisions.

Strong Suggestion: Mentors can call/email the Community Sponsor prior to the start of Senior Project to make sure everything is ready.

Mentors may also call the Community Sponsor during the first week of Senior Project to check in and make sure things are going well.

Mentor Role During Project

The student is required to check in with their Mentor once each week while they are on Project.

This does not need to be a face-to-face meeting here at school. A conversation via phone or facetime works as well. We just ask for an actual conversation, rather than a text/email exchange. Scheduling a time to talk each week is the responsibility of the student.

If the student doesn't meet with you during the first week of Senior Project, please let the SP team know.

The expectation is that Seniors will follow through with their responsibilities to meet with you and if they aren't, they can be pulled from Senior Project.
