During your project...





Do I attend advisery?

No! Even if you are on a modified program and coming back for other courses, you DO NOT attend advisery.

Do I have to work during traditional school hours?

No! Some projects may require you to work afternoon, night, or weekend hours...that's OK!

Can I plan an outof-town project?

Yes! All travel and lodging arrangements must be made by you. You cannot do an out-of-town project if you are on a modified project.

Can I do a partner project?

Depends... as long as there is a good reason that the Project would require two people.


Find a community sponsor
