
# **Connections, Support, and Prevention**

  - Other Connections




# Physical Safety Measures and Daily Procedures

- Limited entry points staffed by our Security personnel
  - At the beginning of the day: greeting students and checking IDs
  - In the middle of the day: greeting visitors through our door buzzer system, verifying ID, and running background checks



# Physical Safety Measures and Daily Procedures

- · Video surveillance in hallways and at entries and exits
- Door hardware, signage, and electronic warning system
- School Resource Officer on each campus who is a member of the respective Police Department
- Continuous monitoring of TrevTips online reporting
- . Threat Assessment Team protocol and follow-up
- . Strong partnership with law enforcement



# **Emergency Procedures and Readiness**

- Yearly training of staff and students for all emergency situations
- An "emergency awareness day" to review procedures in each class
- Yearly emergency drills with police and fire departments present
- Signage and identification of safe spaces for lockdown
- · Site for hosting local law enforcement trainings
- Communication capabilities to staff, students and families, via text, email, etc.





#### **Lockdown Alarms**

Timing of lockdown alarm and message is 3 minutes.

Remain in lockdown until further direction.



#### **Cell Phone Numbers**

We will use text communication with students, staff and parents for emergency situations ONLY, such as a snow day or communication of a lockdown.

# **Emergency Procedures Signage and Map**

#### LOCKDOWN! STOP AND THINK! RUN→HIDE→FIGHT

#### LOCKDOWN RUN! (ALARM TONE AND ANNOUNCEMENT "FIND A SAFE SPACE") STUDENTS STAFF

If there is an accessible path, evacuate, Evacuate to Sears School, Greeley School or Evacuate to Sears, Greeley School or North Shore Country Day School

If there is an accessible path, evacuate. North Shore Country Day School



#### LOCKDOWN HIDE! LOCKS, LIGHTS, OUT OF SIGHT

Move away from sight (Safe Space)

STAFF

Maintain silence

Look for people in hallways Lock interior door and turn off lights Move away from sight Do not open door



#### LOCKDOWN FIGHT! STUDENTS AND STAFF

As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and incapacitate the threat



#### EVACUATE! (to the communicated location)


#### SHELTER! (for tornado, hazmat, earthquake) (HIGH-LOW-TONE ALARM) STUDENTS STAFF

Evacuate to shelter area (Away from concourse and windows) Drop, cover and hold

As you exit, close windows and door

Seal room if hazmat Take attendance

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

# **Open Space**

A highly visible space that cannot be locked and will require you to move to safe space in an emergency. Find a safe space!

### **Examples of Open Spaces:**

**Winnetka:** Trevian Commons, Library Commons, Auditoriums, Gyms, bathrooms, hallway, some classrooms.

**NF:** Cafeteria, B Lounge, A Lounge, F Lobby, Auditorium, bathrooms, hallways.

# **A Safe Space**

A space you can hide in and includes:

- Low visibility from hallway
- The ability to lock the entry (door)

# **Safe Space Signage**



The following is an example of signage we will be posting to easily identify SAFE SPACES in the building.

# SAFE SPACE

In the event of a LOCKDOWN stay in this space

Quickly clear the hallways, lock the door, draw the shades, and turn off the lights SILENCE YOUR CELL PHONES

THE RESERVE AND ADDRESS.

# **LOCKDOWN** STOP AND THINK! RUN → HIDE → FIGHT

### **RUN**

If there is an accessible escape path, attempt to evacuate the building and go to reunification site.

### **HIDE**

If running is not possible, find a safe space to hide where the threat is less likely to find you, preferably behind a locked door.

### **FIGHT**

As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and incapacitate the threat. Throw anything and spread apart.







### **DECISION MAKING**

After the initial lockdown alarm questions to ask yourself:
What do I see?
What do I hear?
Am I in an open space or safe space?


