GRADUATING CLASS TEAMS

Starting this fall, every class of students will have a team of administrators, adviser chairs, and student services liaisons following their individual progress, providing support when needed, and communicating with families and teachers to help all students reach their goals.

The Graduating Class Teams are a new support structure New Trier implemented in response to the growing need for academic and social-emotional assistance among high school students.

Currently students stay together in Adviser Rooms all four years, and Advisers move with them at the Winnetka Campus. However, other roles such as Adviser Chairs and student services liaisons have typically changed each year as students moved from freshmen to seniors.

The new teams will follow students all four years of high school, strengthening the most important idea behind New Trier's Adviser Program - the Adviser at the center of the school/family/student connection. With the change, not only will the Adviser understand a student's needs as they move through high school, but that student and their family will have several other staff members following their experience and offering consistent support.

In addition to the Advisers and two Adviser Chairs, each team has a new position overseeing its work - an Assistant Principal specific to the graduating class - as well as liaisons from Social Work, School Psychologists, Post-High School Counseling, Special Education, and multi-tiered supports.

STUDENT SCHEDULE AND STUDENT GUIDEBOOK

Your student's class schedule will be viewable through the <u>PowerSchool web portal</u> starting Friday, August 4. Student schedules will list courses by class period. Teacher names will be shared on the first day of school. Also, on the first day of school, families can begin to view schedule information on the PowerSchool mobile app. Gradebooks will not be viewable in PowerSchool until Monday, September 11. The easiest way for students and families to keep track of their schedule, blue/green/anchor days, days off, and more is by using the **New Trier Block Schedule app**, which is automatically downloaded to all student iPads and can be accessed through the App Store for <u>Apple</u> devices or the Google Play Store for <u>Android</u> devices. You can also search for "New Trier Block" in either app store. Students can input their individual schedules into the app.

We will distribute our *Student Guidebook* electronically to families in late August and post it on our website. The Student Guidebook contains information on student services, school policies and procedures, and students' rights and responsibilities, along with other useful information. While the Guidebook is a useful reference, it does not include every District policy. Those policies, which may be added or changed during the year, can be found on our <u>Board of Education web page</u>.

ATTENDANCE CHANGES

We believe that students are most successful in achieving their personal and academic goals when they are present in school. This fall, each family will receive a copy of our *Attendance Handbook* which was created to help our Graduating Class Teams support consistent student attendance. Advisers will also review the expectations with students when they return to school. Students and families will receive increased communication from the school as absenteeism increases. FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL INFORMATION-August 21, 2023

We are excited to announce that the <u>first day of school</u> for the upcoming year will be on **Monday, August 21**. It's important to note that the schedule for the first day will differ for each grade level.

- **Class of 2027 (Freshman)** will begin their day at **8:00 a.m.** with a Special Adviser Room where they will participate in orientation and community building activities. Students will learn how to read their schedule and take a quick tour of the campus led by their senior helper. After the Special Adviser Room students will attend their classes, and a light lunch will be provided during period 5.
- Class of 2026 (Sophomores) will begin their day by reporting to their adviser room at 8:20 a.m., where they will have the opportunity to meet with their adviser. Following this, there will be an orientation program for the Class of 2026 to help familiarize them with the year ahead.
- **Class of 2025 and 2024 (Juniors and Seniors)**, will start their day by going directly to their adviser room at **9:15 a.m**. This will give them a chance to connect with their advisers and receive any necessary guidance.

Please be aware that the first day will be an Anchor Day, Early Dismissal. School will end at 1:20 p.m. at Northfield and 1:40 p.m. at Winnetka. We kindly request that you refer to the links provided for additional information regarding the <u>first day of school</u>, the <u>school year</u> <u>calendar</u>, <u>daily bell schedules</u> and <u>district calendars</u>.

Traffic and parking can be confusing, especially during the first week. We appreciate your patience early in the year. Please review the <u>Winnetka Traffic and Parking</u> and <u>Northfield Traffic</u> and <u>Parking</u> maps if you are dropping your student off at school.
