

Class of 2030 Placement Testing

Placement Testing at New Trier's Winnetka Campus

1. New Trier's Placement Exam will be administered on the dates below at the **Winnetka Campus**. Families can choose **ONE** of these two test days:

Saturday, November 15th
Saturday, November 22nd

Families must use the [Placement Test Sign Up form](#) to register for ONE test day. You will need your student's New Trier ID number to sign up for the placement test. The procedures will be identical on both days.

**Students with accommodations will be testing at New Trier and can sign up for either test day.*

2. The New Trier placement test will be administered digitally. **Students must bring their sender school issued device on their testing day.** Students cannot take the placement test on a personal device because it will not have the testing program. **If students do not have a school-issued device, New Trier will provide one for testing.**
3. Students can enter the Winnetka campus at either of the two entrances:

Trevian Way, enter through **Northwest entrance N16**
 Winnetka Avenue, enter through **South entrance S2**

Families are encouraged to carpool to minimize traffic congestion and ensure students arrive on time. Staff will guide students to their assigned rooms and room assignments will be posted throughout the building.

Placement Test FAQs



1.) Is the placement test the only information that is used for level placement?

- The CTP5 tests are only one component of the portfolio used to place students in appropriate course levels at New Trier. The student self-assessment and writing sample are completed during the testing period and teacher feedback forms are completed at the sender schools. Parents will also complete a student profile to provide more detailed information about their student. These materials are *all* an important part of the placement recommendations made by New Trier faculty.

2.) How do I register my student for the placement test?

- Complete the [Placement Test Sign Up form](#). You must have your student's New Trier ID number to sign up for a test day. You can find your student's New Trier ID number in the body of the email. *You will receive a confirmation of your test date when you complete the placement test sign up form.* You will also receive a reminder about the placement test seven days before your student's test date.

3.) What if a student has a conflict with the test dates or cannot test on a Saturday due to religious beliefs?

- Please contact the testing department at testing@nthsh.net to schedule an alternate date.

4.) What assessment instrument is used for placement?

- Five tests within the Educational Records Bureau's "The Comprehensive Testing Program 5" (CTP5) will be administered. The components of the assessment to be given are: Verbal Reasoning, Reading Comprehension, Quantitative Reasoning, Mathematics Part 1 and Mathematics Part 2. **There are NO calculators allowed on the CTP5 test.** Information concerning ERB and its programs may be found at www.erblearn.org. Students will be taking the placement test on their sender school issued electronic device.

5.) When and where should students report? How long is the test?

- Testing takes place on the **WINNETKA CAMPUS**. Students will enter through the Winnetka Avenue S2 door or the Trevian Way door N16 between 7:15 a.m. and 7:45 a.m.
- Posters will be displayed in the building with student names and assigned room numbers. Proctors will be available throughout the school to direct students to classrooms.
- **Students must bring their sender school issued electronic device. Students cannot use a personal device for testing. If they do not have a device, New Trier will provide one for the placement test. Please make sure student devices are charged.**
- Standard testing time is 210 minutes. Students with extended time will be able to contact guardians with approximate pick-up time. Students may bring water and a snack to eat during breaks.

6.) How will students with accommodations be tested?

- Students with accommodations will test at the Winnetka Campus on November 15th and November 22nd. They should sign up for the test using the [Placement Test Sign Up form](#). Students who have an active and current 504 Plan or IEP, as determined by their public school, through the Section 504 eligibility process, will receive all testing accommodations as noted on their active and current plan.

Students who receive accommodations in a private school or parochial school setting via a Learning Plan or other school specific plan should work with their private school to provide New Trier with the documentation used to determine the need for accommodations. Once New Trier receives documentation *from the school*, we will determine eligibility for accommodations in a public-school setting. Eligibility requirements for accommodations in a private school setting can differ from those in a public-school setting.

7.) When will students receive the test results?

- Test results will be available to families in late January along with New Trier level recommendations and course selection materials. All materials will be made available to families digitally. You will receive an email with a student specific code that will allow you to access your Class of 2030 student's placement materials. New Trier will not be mailing test results/recommendations through the postal service.

8.) What should students do to prepare for the exam?

- THERE IS NO TEST PREPARATION NECESSARY FOR THE CTP5 PLACEMENT EXAM. The best way for students to prepare for this exam is to do well in their classes and continue to learn the skills and concepts that are being covered in their eighth-grade subjects.

In November, incoming 9th grade families will receive an email to set up a New Trier PowerSchool account. Establishing a PowerSchool account for your Class of 2030 student includes all sections listed below.

ParentSquare Communication

New Trier uses **ParentSquare** for school communication with families, primarily through email, text and app notifications. **ParentSquare** *automatically* generates an account for each parent, using their preferred email address and phone number on file.

We also encourage parents to access their **ParentSquare** accounts through the **ParentSquare** app. This allows families to update their preferences on *when* and *how* they are notified.
