
Individualized Transition Planning:



- Accessing the Community





Independent Living:

To assist our young adults in making the transition to adulthood, care has been taken to create an individualized schedule that feels less like high school and more like an adult work environment. Instruction focuses on life skills such a meal planning and preparation, health and safety, public transportation skills, money management, recreation skills, and communication skills.

Vocational Training:

Vocational training is important to increase each student's independence. Most job placements are in the community. Job coaches support





Accessing the Community:

Students participate in communitybased instruction to practice a variety of independent living skills. Students are in the community several times a week accessing a variety of settings.

Examples include:
