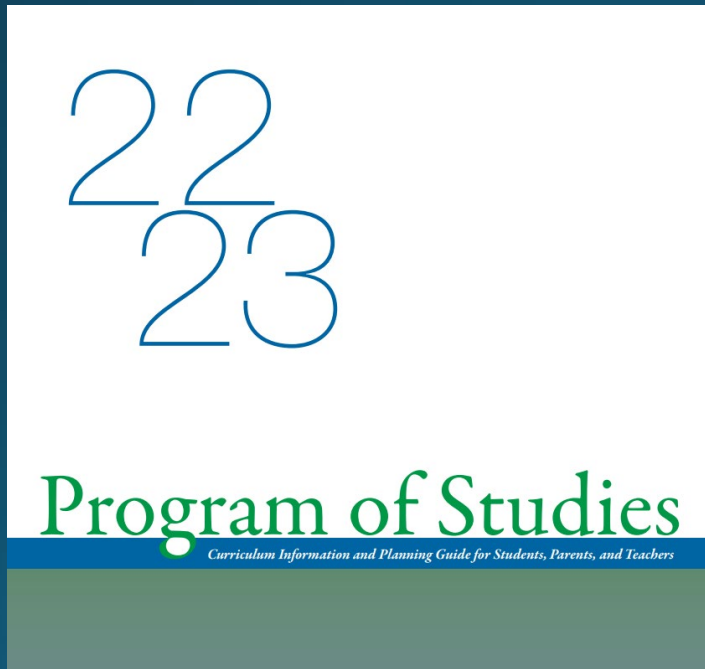

Subject Specific Considerations

- MATH: 3 years required to graduate (but some colleges require 4)
- SOCIAL STUDIES: US History (level 2, 3, or AP) IGSS or American Studies level 9 or 4. Graduation requirement
 - Strongly recommend at least 3 years
 - Civics required to graduate
- MCL: 2 years minimum, but 3-4 recommended: 2 + 2 doesn't equal 4
- English: 4 years!
- Science 3-4 years!

Elective Courses!

- Outstanding opportunities to explore fields beyond core academics
- Electives can reflect a talent, interest and/or passion
- Individuality and well-roundedness
- Art, music, theatre, business, PLTW, architecture, photography, dance, cuisine, automotives, (and more)
- Explore an area that could be a future career interest or college major.
- New Trier has as plentiful elective choices as you will find in a high school.

Some Helpful Background

- 90% of New Trier students take a mix levels
- 65% of students took 19 or more core academic credits
- Weighted vs. unweighted grade point averages

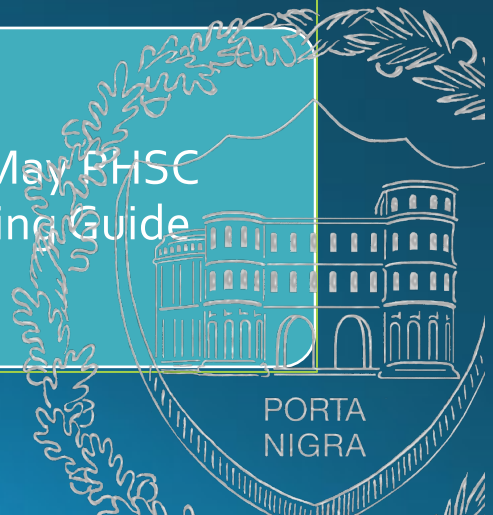
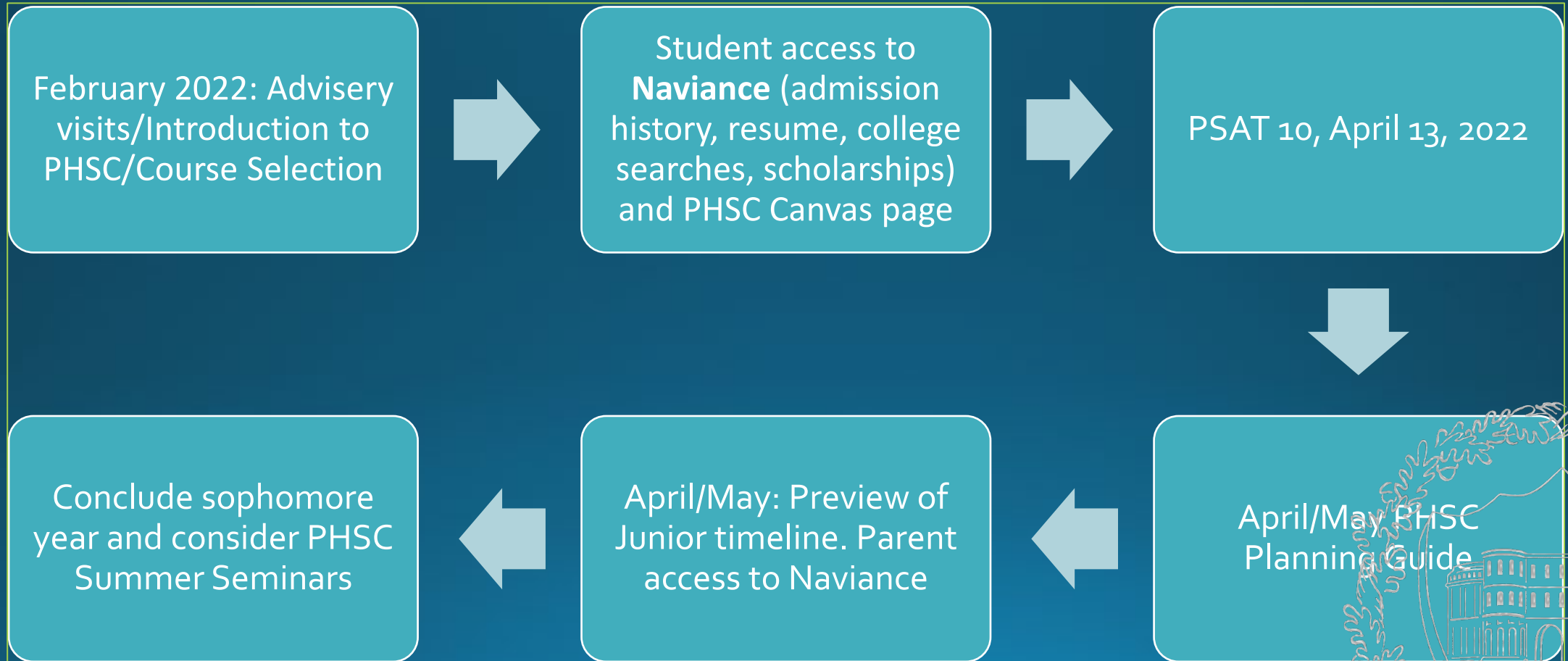

Set Goals	Set realistic and manageable expectations for yourself
Be Authentic	Pursue opportunities for authentic service work and contributions to others/community
Demonstrate Care	Demonstrate daily acts of character and provide evidence of character in your extracurricular activities
Manage Your Time	Consider any substantial family contributions or external commitments/challenges that may impact your schedule
Find Balance	Pursue coursework and activities that are fitting for your strengths and interests
Prioritize You	Be authentic, and prioritize self-care

Extra! Extra! Read all about it!

- Extracurricular activities enhance a student's experiences outside the classroom.
- Demonstrates values, investments and time commitments
- Balance academic choices with extracurricular activities
- Can reflect what a student's nonacademic interests are and the types of diverse perspective they can contribute to campus
- No set formula
- Depth more than breadth
- Enhances skill development: leadership, service, employment
