#### GENERAL

Abbott & Fenner Business Consultants offer a scholarship of up to \$1,000 each year to the winner of their essay contest question: “Describe your educational career and life goals. Explain your plan for achieving these goals. This is available to all high school juniors and seniors. Application deadline is June 10, 2023.

AES Engineers is offering a \$500 award to all students, regardless of their field of study. Students must submit an essay of between 500 and 1000 words in answer to the following question: *When you look back on your life in 30 years, what would it take for you to consider your life successful? There is no application packet for this award. Please do not include your resume at this time. The Alzheimer’s Association of America offers the \$5,000 *AFA Teens for Alzheimer’s Awareness Scholarship* to a student with personal experience with the disease. Applicants are asked to write an essay (1,500 word maximum) or submit a video no more than 4 minutes long, describing the impact of Alzheimer’s disease or another dementia-related illness on themselves, their families, or their communities, and what they have learned from it. The American Meteorological Society offers a \$5,000 Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship to encourage students to study in the atmospheric and related sciences. The Society encourages applications from women, minorities, and disabled students, traditionally underrepresented in the atmospheric and related oceanic and hydrologic sciences. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold permanent resident status, be entering their freshman year of college in the fall of 2023 as a full-time student and plan to pursue a degree in the atmospheric or related oceanic or hydrologic sciences (marine biology does not meet this requirement), and must have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Scholarship amounts range from \$2,500 one-year awards to \$20,000 multi-year awards. APIA Scholars has a special focus on supporting students who live at or below the poverty line; are in the first generation of their family to attend college; are representative of the APIA community's diversity, (geographically and ethnically}, especially those ethnicities that have been underrepresented on college campuses due to limited access and opportunity. Strong applicants would also have an emphasis on community service and leadership. Students must be a U.S. citizen, U.S. National, legal permanent resident or a citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia, Republic of the Marshall Islands, or the Republic of Palau. Recipients must be enrolling as an undergraduate student in a U.S. accredited college or university in the fall of 2023. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.7 out of 4.0 or a GED.
