

Join Us Sept. 9 at New Trier's New Academic and Athletic Facility

This school year, New Trier is opening a brand new academic and athletic facility - and the entire New Trier community is invited to check out the new spaces on Saturday, September 9 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Please join us at the East Side Academic and Athletic Project Dedication Ceremony and Open House at the Winnetka Campus, 385 Winnetka Avenue. The events will kick off with a ribbon cutting at 2 p.m. outside the doors to the new competition gym, followed by a brief ceremony inside the gym. Parking will be available in the lots along Essex Road and on Trevian Way.

During the open house, students and staff will be on hand to answer questions as visitors take selfguided tours of the spaces. The celebration also will include student performances, refreshments, and demonstrations in the new building.

In February 2021, the New Trier Board of Education approved a plan to renovate and replace aging buildings on the East Side of the Winnetka Campus with new athletic and academic spaces to expand student opportunities for generations to come without the need for a referendum.

The \$79.5 million project, funded by existing resources, replaced the 1928 Gates Gymnasium and 1925 Boiler Plant - both inflexible spaces with high maintenance costs - with a new multipurpose facility within the boundaries of Essex Road and Trevian Way. The project broke ground in January 2022 and opened to students and staff this August.

Highlights of the new facility include:

- new competition gym and auxiliary gym
- 14 new academic classrooms
- climbing wall and high ropes course
- 6-lane indoor track
- weight and cardio facilities
- food service and concessions area
- spirit shop

The project includes many nods to the former Gates Gymnasium, including the use of reclaimed wood from the former gym on track bleachers and in the concession area, the New Trier center court symbol from the old gym featured in the Athletics/Kinetic Wellness office lobby, and inclusion of the former Gates Gymnasium sign on the office wall.

The new facility would not be possible without the support of the New Trier community, and we look forward to seeing you at our celebration on Saturday, September 9.



Did you know that New Trier High School has won more Illinois High School Association state championships than any other high school? If you would like to share in that Trevian pride and see some excellent student athletes in action, we invite you to come to one of our many sporting events.

With 35 sports offered at multiple team levels, New Trier has many opportunities for fans to root on their Trevians each year. Home games generally take place at the Northfield Campus stadium, fields, tennis courts, and gyms (7 Happ Road), the Winnetka Campus gyms and tracks (385 Winnetka Avenue), and Duke Childs Field (at the intersection of Willow and Hibbard roads in Winnetka).

Most sporting events are free for fans to attend; football and basketball games have a nominal admission fee.

What's Happening at Duke Childs Field in Winnetka?

If you have driven past the intersection of Willow and Hibbard Roads in Winnetka over the past several months, you might have asked: "What's happening at Duke Childs Field?"

The home of Trevian baseball, softball and other athletic events is getting much-needed improvements in conjunction with the Village of Winnetka's stormwater project.

New Trier, along with the Winnetka Park District, Winnetka School District 36, and the Cook County Forest Preserve, partnered with the village to help address significant flooding issues in Winnetka and surrounding areas. During the first phase of the project, the village installed stormwater collection and holding tanks under Duke Childs Field.

Now that the village has completed its work, New Trier is taking advantage of the field restoration to revitalize the site. These improvements include a reconfiguration of the fields to add a second softball field - resulting in two baseball fields and two softball fields that will be used by both New Trier student-athletes and community teams. Both the varsity baseball and softball fields will include turf, reducing disruption to the season. Thank you to the donors who contributed to the turf project.

In addition, New Trier is replacing its outdated bathroom and locker building and adding new batting cages, fencing, dugouts, backstops, protective netting, and a new scoreboard. The site also will have improved parking and accessible pathways for visitors.

New Trier is on track to complete its renovations this fall and have the fields ready for play by the spring baseball and softball seasons. Please join us to root for the Trevians on their brand new fields!



Show Your New Trier Spirit with the One Stop Trev Shop

Are you looking for New Trier spirit gear for students, friends, family, alumni, or yourself? Look no further than the One Stop Trev Shop, serving the New Trier community at two convenient locations.

The One Stop Trev Shop opened its doors on the Winnetka Campus (385 Winnetka Avenue) in 2021. The store was created to provide students with hands-on, real-world employment opportunities while serving as a one-stop shop for Trevian branded items.

At the start of the 2022-2023 school year, New Trier opened a second location as part of the new downtown Glencoe home for New Trier's Transition Program (640 Vernon Avenue). The Transition Program serves young adults ages 18-22 to help them prepare for their transition to adulthood through the development of life skills such as meal planning and money management, job training, and more. Young adults in the program also staff the store and produce items in-house through the 266 Designs production studio.

With the opening of the East Side Academic and Athletic facility this year on the Winnetka Campus, the One Stop Trev Shop on that campus now has a permanent home across from the new competition gymnasium.

New Trier Partners with University of Illinois on Design Thinking Program



Since the opening of its doors in 1901, New Trier has embodied the best of secondary education and gained a reputation for excellence that is acknowledged by educators throughout the country. The New Trier educational experience benefits students for their entire lifetime. New Trier alumni go on to be leaders, entrepreneurs, and innovators.

This school year, the New Trier Educational Foundation (NTEF) is thrilled to announce its support of a new partnership between the University of Illinois' Siebel Center for Design (SCD) and New Trier High School to launch a design thinking program.

NTEF was founded in 2001, and for over 20 years, it has provided private funding for exceptional educational opportunities and special projects that are not funded – or are not fully funded – by the District 203 budget. The Foundation is committed to maintaining and enhancing the unique New Trier educational experience.

Design thinking, also known as "human centered design," is a problem-solving approach rooted in empathy in which participants identify the unmet needs of a population to design solutions collaboratively and across disciplines - all with the end user in mind. This type of thinking asks people to solve a problem with no obvious solution or precedent.

At the November 2022 Board of Education meeting, Assistant Superintendent Peter Tragos told the Board that a design thinking approach aligns closely with many of the District's strategic planning goals. The program will help provide students with high-demand durable skills like adaptability, critical thinking, and collaboration that employers seek.

New Trier, in partnership with NTEF, has been refining ideas for a human centered design program since 2019 when a small group of teachers from different departments proposed an all-day workshop to present ideas for a design thinking school. The group has since had four successful retreats bringing together teachers, staff, students, parents, alumni, community members, and industry professionals. The group has also visited the Siebel Center for Design to learn from their launch in 2021.

The Siebel Center will help New Trier plan a pilot program this school year focusing on the following four areas of support and collaboration: Professional Development, Curriculum Development, Research + Assessment, and Mechanics + Rollout Actions.

Hearts to Compassion and Lives to Service: Giving Back at New Trier

Any New Trier student who has graduated in the last several decades can probably recite the New Trier motto by heart: To commit minds to inquiry, hearts to compassion, and lives to the service of humanity.

Since the school's founding, service to others has been a critical part of New Trier's identity. Each year students participate in service projects big and small, from lunch time bake sales in support of different charities to toiletry collections (4), clothing drives (3), online auctions, and community garden (2), forest preserve, and beach clean-ups. Students in Social Service clubs (6) volunteer at dozens of organizations throughout the community, serving as mentors, tutors (7), buddies, and more. Other service clubs support specific efforts, such as refurbishing technology to donate to area students in need (5) or collecting formal attire to donate for school dances.

New Trier community members are encouraged to get involved with student service projects or suggest some of their own. Each year, New Trier is one of the Greater Chicago Food Depository's biggest contributors to their winter food drive, sponsored by the Tri-Ship and Girls Club student service organizations. Collection barrels (8) are available at both campuses, and community members also can donate to New Trier's drive online.

A popular fundraiser at the Winnetka Campus is the Tri-Ship Tree Sale (1), offering fresh holiday trees and wreaths in support of the club's scholarship efforts. Check the New Trier web site starting in November for dates - the trees sell out fast!

The New Trier Educational Foundation also hosts a day of service each year, when New Trier community members, alumni, students, parents, and staff can join service projects in the New Trier community and across the country.

New Trier and the Red Cross: A Life-Saving Partnership

As schools and businesses shut down at the beginning of the COVID pandemic, one critical need that emerged was a safe way to collect blood donations. Schools, with spacious areas such as gymnasiums and cafeterias and ample electrical outlets and entrances/exits, offered a way to bring in donors while keeping them safely distanced.

New Trier answered a call from the Red Cross to be a host site early in the pandemic, and a life-saving partnership was born. Now the school is a community host site for monthly blood drives each year, saving thousands of lives in the process.

Since the partnership began in 2020, New Trier has hosted 24 blood drives, potentially saving an estimated 4,563 lives through the donation of 1,521 units of blood.

The Red Cross and New Trier work together to find times around school breaks and days off to host blood drives without disrupting school operations. The blood drives take place at the Northfield Campus, 7 Happ Road, in the cafeteria. Both the school and the Red Cross follow strict safety standards for blood collection, blood handling, and cleanup of the space before and after the drives.
